You form the **simple past** of **regular verbs** with **-ed**.

⚠ Be careful with the spelling of these verbs:

practise, dance: practised, danced

chat, stop: chatted, stopped


study: studied (but: play – played)



I studied for the English test **yesterday**.  
**Last weekend** we visited my grandmother.  
I played football with my friends **on Sunday**.

You use the **simple past** to say what you **did** or what **happened in the past**.

**Signal words:** yesterday, last week, last year, on Monday, at 8 o'clock, ...

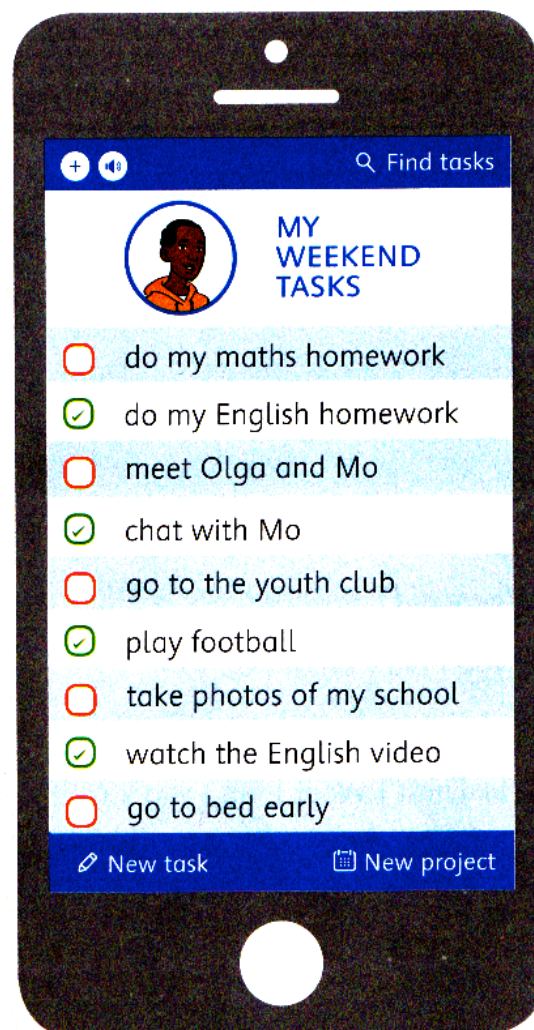
